2010 IDAHO INDOOR SOCCER STATE CUP

LOCATION: Boise, Idaho



1. SANCTIONING & REFEREES

This event is part of the National Indoor Soccer Championship and it is sanctioned by the National Indoor Soccer Council (NISC), the United States Indoor Soccer Association (USIndoor) and IYSA (Idaho Youth Soccer Association). **Referees** for this event will be US Indoor Association Certified.

3. FORMAT

- Boys and Girls
- Current Year Age Brackets
- U5-U7 coed & U8, U9, U10 → 5 v 5 (Max Roster Size: 10 players)
- U11-U12 → 7v7 (Max. Roster Size:14 players. Recommended: 11 players)
- U13-U19 → 6v6 (Max. Roster Size:12 players. Recommended: 10 players)
- 3 games minimum
- Games: Two 22 minutes halves with 1 minutes break between halves.



4. REFEREES

Referees will be [US Indoor Association Certified](#). Referees and Timekeepers fees are included in the tournament fee. If you're interested in getting US Indoor Soccer Referee Certification, please visit www.IdahoIndoorSoccer.org.

7. EQUIPMENT

- Uniforms
 - Home team (listed first in schedule) will wear a light colour jersey.
 - Visitor team will wear a dark colour jersey.
- Cleats
 - Molded cleats are allowed in the Boise Indoor Soccer Arena.
- Ball
 - U5-U7 -- size 3
 - U8-U12 -- size 4 (size 5, OK if both coaches agree)
 - U13-U18 -- size 5
 - Home team to supply balls.

8. POINT SYSTEM

This regional tournament follows the National Indoor Soccer Championship point system (with the exception of tie breaker #8, which has been slightly modified):

POINTS

1. FIVE points shall be awarded for a win.
2. TWO point shall be awarded for a tie.
3. ZERO points shall be awarded for a loss.

BONUS POINTS

Bonus points will be awarded for the scoring of goals. All goals count as one point only.

- 4 or Less goals: 0 points
- 5 or 6 goals: 1 point
- 7 or 8 goals: 2 points

9 and above: 3 points
(Max' game total = 3)

TIE BREAKERS

The following tie breaking procedures will be used to determine league winners or contenders for play-off seeding.

1. Most points (without bonus).
2. Head to Head.

Note on the application of the "Head to Head" tie breaker for round robin groups or in groups where teams have played each other more than once:

If the teams involved in a tie breaker situation have the same number of points (without bonus), begin the tie breaker sequence below, #3-#7, considering only the games played between the teams that are tied (head to head competition).

If a winner cannot be determined in this way, re-start the sequence #3-#7 considering all games played by the teams in question. Also, if teams involved have not played each other, then go through the sequence #3-#7 considering all games played by the teams in question. Go to tie breaker #8 as the last resource.

3. Most bonus points.
4. Goal Difference.
5. Most goals scored.
6. Least goals conceded.
7. Most shutouts
8. FIFA "Kicks from the Penalty Mark" If "Kicks from the Penalty Mark" are required, they will be scheduled shortly after the last game of the group or when time and field availability permits. Coin Toss will be used to break the tie when PKs are not viable because field unavailability.

Please note: Each position, either within a division or between divisions, will be determined separately. For example where 3 teams within a division are tied on game points and all 3 beat each other and the fourth place team during round play then the team with the most bonus points will advance as division winner. If a second team advances from round play out of that division then the tie breaking sequence will begin again and head to head competition between just those two teams will be the second tie breaker. All division winners will automatically advance to elimination round play.

POINTS IN FORFEITED GAMES

The team receiving a forfeit will be awarded the normal points for a win and a score which is the average of their goals for and against in their other games (minimum of 1-0 victory).

If a team forfeits all of its games, each team in the bracket will receive a score that is the average of their goals scored minus average goals conceded in their other round games (minimum of 1-0 victory).

9. **INDOOR SOCCER RULES**

All FIFA and US Indoor Association Rules apply. In case of uncertainty, the Official Rules of Indoor Soccer will apply.
